

Macleans Primary School Enrolment Scheme.
Effective from 20 July 2020

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the intersection of Loloma Drive (excluded) and Bucklands Beach Road (even addresses 264 and above included, odd addresses 281 and above included) travel south along Bucklands Beach Road (Sunderlands Road addresses 46 and above included and Glennandrew Drive included.

Jillteresa Crescent, Dianne-Louise Drive, and Mark Edward Drive excluded). Continue south along Bucklands Beach Road (Gills Road even addresses 4 – 146 and odd addresses 3 – 209 included. Casuarina Road odd addresses 1-41 included and even addresses 2-46 included.

Lisa Rise, Fiesta Drive, Darren Crescent, Lyren Place, Mandarin Place, Damson Place and Tangelo Place included) to Aviemore Drive. Continue travelling south along Aviemore Drive (odd addresses 3-125 only included and even addresses 22-104 only included and De Quincey Terrace included) then travel east onto Aberfeldy Avenue (Aberfeldy even addresses 6-84 only included and odd addresses 1-83 only included.

Eske Place, Anure Place, Veagh Place, Struan Place, Glenshee Place and Ballater Place included. Pakuranga Road addresses 503-509 only included. Dalwhinnie Parade excluded and Highland Park Drive addresses 20 and above excluded) and continue north along Aberfeldy Avenue to Hutchinson Road. Travel north along Hutchinsons Road (addresses 157 and below only included. Dell Way and Finnerty Avenue excluded) to Gill Road. Continue north east along Gills Road and then north along Bleakhouse Road (even addresses 64-98 only included, Haseler Crescent excluded).

At the roundabout travel north west along Macleans Road (odd addresses 49 -135 only included). Travel across country and follow the boundary of Macleans Road Reserve/Macleans Park to The Esplanade (excluded). Continue to follow the Macleans Park boundary then travel across country to the intersection between Macleans Road and Richard Avenue (odd addresses included only). Travel west along Richard Avenue to Bucklands Beach Road and then south along Bucklands Beach Road back to the starting point. All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zones unless otherwise stated.

Proof of residence within the home zone will be required. Examples of this are:

- Current Electricity Bill
- Tenancy Agreement
- Bank Statement
- Rates Demand

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date that will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places that can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out-of-Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places that are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school and on the school website. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

- (a) **First priority** must be given to students who meet the criteria for enrolment in an approved special programme. ***This priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary.***
- (b) **Second priority** must be given to siblings of current students.
- (c) **Third priority** must be given to siblings of former students.
- (d) **Fourth priority** must be given to children of former students.
- (e) **Fifth priority** must be given to children of board employees or board members.
- (f) **Sixth priority** must be given to all other students.

If there are more applicants in priority groups (b)-(f) than there are places available, places must be allocated in priority order until a category is reached where the number of spaces available in that category is insufficient to accommodate the number of eligible students. Selection within that priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school and on the school website.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status will be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
